New traffic calming measures have now been implemented in Uniondale and north of

Thamesford, and additional measures in Embro. Each of these is based on nationwide, evidence based best practices. Each is also a one year trial that will be measured: if it works it will be left there, if it doesn't it will be removed, changed, or added to. This now means that over the last four years new traffic calming measures have been implemented entering every Zorra community, and the Township has a Traffic Calming Policy that allows residents to request traffic calming measures. The next step is to monitor for effectiveness and look for opportunities to further improve.



Zorra Maintenance Facility

Construction continues at the new Zorra Maintenance Facility (ZMF) with completion expected this fall. This new facility will house all of our Public Works Staff and equipment in one location. The facility is located beside the existing Kintore Shop on Road 78, just east of Highway 119. An Open House will be planned once the facility is complete.



Share the Road

Farm operations are always extremely active in the fall with harvest season. Please pay special attention to the large equipment moving about on Zorra roads. Especially during this busy time of the year, we like everyone to share the road equally, be aware, and be courteous. We know farmers are extremely busy during harvest



time and it is important to take that extra care regardless of which vehicle they are using.

Brush, Leaf and Yard Waste Depot

Zorra has a Depot for brush, leaf, and yard waste. Located across the road from the Kintore Public Works Shop at 783045 Road 78, just east of Highway 19.

- Acceptable materials include: fruits and vegetables, garden hedge and tree trimmings, grass, leaves, Halloween pumpkins, house and garden plants, brush (no longer than 6ft). and Christmas trees.
- Unacceptable materials include: garbage, old fencing, plastic bags, hazardous waste, top soil, rocks, and stumps.

This depot is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. There is no charge for this service.

Construction Zone Sign Classification

In a Construction Zone, "Local Traffic Only" means you are accessing a property inside the section of road that is closed. It does NOT mean that you live in the area adjacent to the construction and the closed road is the shortest distance to your destination. It is a Highway Traffic Act Offence to misuse this privilege.

Building

Obtaining a Building Permit in Zorra:

Fill out a Building Permit Application, either in person at the Township Office or online www.zorra.ca

In addition to the completed application form, applicants must also submit building drawings, plans and other documents to the Township of Zorra for processing. A detailed description of the planned work and intended occupancy, identification of the building lot or site, a valuation of the proposed work including materials and labour costs are required.

Building Permit Fees:

Zorra has adopted new Building Permit Fees. To view the fees visit our website at www.zorra.ca

A Building Permit is NOT required for a fence.

Failure to obtain a Building Permit will result in a penalty.

Sanitary Sewage Systems

The Township Building Department now oversees the private sanitary sewage system approvals for Zorra. Historically, Southwestern Public Health managed this function, however it has been passed on to the Township to manage. If you have questions or concerns regarding these approvals contact the Building Department.



Multi-Station Training

This year, Firefighters from all three Zorra Township fire stations - located in Thamesford, Embro, and Uniondale - have been participating in multi-station training to build comradery and skills for working together on large scale scenes. One multi-station practice took place in Embro where a pump relay was performed through a local subdivision. Another focused on extrication strategies for hybrid and electric vehicles and most recently Firefighters completed training on Rural water supply with multiple apparatus and various types of equipment. Upcoming multi-station practices will include heavy auto-extrication with larger type vehicles such as transports trucks as well as live fire and water rescue training

Multi-station training is a crucial aspect of Zorra Fire, as it ensures an overall understanding and level of preparedness for multistation emergency calls. Further it helps unite the members from all three stations through working together in training and not just on scene at an emergency. Zorra Fire is thrilled to present these training opportunities to our firefighters and upcoming recruits.

By-Law Enforcement

Municipal Enforcement Unit

Due to unforeseen circumstances the Municipal Enforcement Unit (MEU) has shut down their services throughout Southwester Ontario. The Township is currently working on a new By-law Enforcement model and will provide an update when the information becomes available

Recreation Vehicle (RV) Parking:

Notice to all RV/boat owners. Our Zoning By-law allows front driveway storage of RVs and boats from May 1 – October 31. After October 31, front driveway storage of these vehicles shall be removed and stored elsewhere. After October 31, the vehicles may be stored on your side lot or rear lot provided that they meet the 5-foot setback from adjacent properties.

Winter Parking

Please be advised that the winter parking restrictions will be enforced starting November 15th and remain in place until March 31, 2023 in accordance with By-law 48-20. For snow removal purposes, parking is not permitted on any road or street from 1:00 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. 7 days a week during this period. Any vehicle owner found in violation of this by-law could be fined or have their vehicle removed/towed at owners' expense. The set fine for this violation is set at \$50.

Leaves/snow removal on to Roadways

The autumn season is quickly approaching and therefore the leaves will begin to fall. As a reminder to all residents, depositing your leaves onto the roadway and sidewalk is dangerous and is a contravention of the Clearing Refuse from Land By-law No. 16-18. If you wish to drop off your yard waste, visit the County of Oxford website to view all brush, leaf, and yard waste depot locations. Pushing or placing any leaves, snow or ice or any other obstruction of a roadway is an offence that carries a Provincial Offences Fine of \$200.00.

Keeping Properties Clean and Clear

In the Township of Zorra, all grass and weeds must be maintained at a height less than 8 inches. This is done to promote safety in the Township, including pest-control, as well as to maintain the appearance of Zorra. Further, property owners and tenants shall keep their land free from industrial and domestic wastes, inoperable motorized vehicles (both licensed or unlicensed), vehicle parts, construction materials, and other refuse. If refuse has started to accumulate on your property, you are required to place it in appropriate containers, stored at the side or rear of your lot, and placed curbside within 14 days.

Tax Department

The Final 2022 Tax Bills were mailed in July. If you have NOT received your bill, please contact the Township Office immediately.

The third instalment is due August 31, 2022 and the fourth AND FINAL instalment is due October 31, 2022.

Payment Options:

- Cash, Cheque or Debit accepted at the office OR
- Online or Telephone banking.

To setup your property taxes as an online bill payment:

- 1. Go to 'add a bill' and search for "Zorra".
- 2. Select Zorra Township Tax and enter the Roll Number from your tax bill as your account number.
- 3. Use your 15-digit roll number on your tax bill, example 011-090-25600-0000, you would enter this as 01109025600. If an error occurs, please add the extra four zeros at the end and try again.

Monthly Pre-Authorized Payment Plan, either on the instalment dates, or a 10 or 12 monthly payment plan.

TASK FORCE

In 2021, the Township began researching alternate public consultation mechanisms to better engage the Zorra community. As a result, the Township decided to move forward with the establishment of "task forces."

Task forces are similar to committees, but they can operate much more informally and give volunteers more flexibility with how and when they will participate. The idea behind task forces is that they will allow residents to participate in local government, remain informed, offer suggestions, and provide meaningful input without the bureaucratic constraints that Zorra Township committees operate within. (e.g., formal agendas and minutes, scheduling set meetings at the beginning of the year, formal meeting procedure, committing to a four-year term, etc.).



CULTURAL MAPPING

WHAT IS CULTURAL MAPPING?

Cultural mapping is a community-based and community-driven process of identifying, recording, and valuing local cultural assets. This includes both tangible assets (assets that have a physical presence) and intangible assets (the stories, traditions, and histories that make up our unique identity).

Cultural mapping involves looking at culture as a multifaceted force in the community. Ways in which culture exists in regions can be broken down into categories.



At this time the Township of Zorra will be focusing on "Resource Mapping".

Once the Resource Mapping has been completed, the Township will begin the process for community identity mapping.

TYPES OF CULTURAL MAPPING

There are two (2) main types of cultural mapping:

1. Resource Mapping

 Resource mapping involves identifying and recording tangible cultural resources, which are then plotted on a map (usually making use of Geographic Information Systems (GIS) tools and platforms).

2. Community Identity Mapping

 Community identity mapping involves exploring 'intangible cultural resources' (i.e., the unique stories and traditions that define a community identity and sense of place).

2022 Municipal Election

A person is entitled to be an elector at an election held in a local municipality, if on voting day they are:

- A Canadian citizen;
- At least 18 years old;
- Residing in the local municipality or an owner or tenant there, or the spouse of such owner or tenant; and
- · Not otherwise prohibited from voting.

At the close of voting on October 24, the totals from all votes will be compiled. The unofficial results will then be displayed at the Township Office at 274620 27th Line and on the Zorra Township website. Feel free to attend!

Check the Voters' List

If you haven't already: please ensure that your information is accurate and on the Voters' List by contacting the Township Office at 519-485-2490 or visiting https://elections.zorra.ca

OR - Please visit the Township elections website and select "Am I on the Voters' List?" to make a request to verify that your name appears on the list for the upcoming Municipal Election.

The revision period for electors to make changes to, or have their name removed, from the list takes effect from September 1, 2022 until Voting Day on October 24, 2022.

If your name appeared on the Provincial Voters' List it DOES NOT mean that you will automatically appear on the Municipal Voters' List! We encourage residents to check that their name appears on the Voters' List and that their information, including school support, is recorded correctly to ensure that they receive the correct voting kit in the mail.

Township Wards & Representation

The Township of Zorra Council consists of the Mayor and four Ward Councillors. There is one Councillor elected by vote of the residents within each Ward. The Mayor, also referred to as the Head of Council, is elected Township wide.

Members of Council are elected by residents to a four-year term of office.

Council acts as the Township's decision-making body. Decisions are made by Council as a whole and by majority vote at Council meetings. The elected Council representatives represent the public and considers the well-being and interests of the Township on a range of issues such as roads, emergency services, buildings, by-law enforcement, licensing, property taxes, winter maintenance, recreation and economic development.

Council develops and determines which services the Township will provide and carries out the duties of Council as provided for in the Municipal Act and the Township's Procedural By-law.

School Boards

Education is a provincial government responsibility in Canada. In Ontario, education is governed principally by the Education Act and its regulations which set out duties and responsibilities of the Minister of Education and of school boards, school board supervisory officers, principals, teachers, parents and students. Ontario's 72 District School Boards operate the province's publicly-funded schools. They are made up of 31 English-language public boards, 29 English-language Catholic boards, 4 French-language public boards, and 8 French-language Catholic boards. A school board is a body that operates the province's publicly funded schools and is governed by its publicly elected members - school board trustees.

Acclamations

Typically, a voter will vote for their ward councillor, mayor, and school board trustee. However, sometimes candidates may be elected by **acclamation**, which means that only one individual filed nomination papers for that position and therefore an election process is not required. You cannot cast a vote for a position that has been acclaimed. For example, if your ward councillor and the mayor position are acclaimed then you may only receive a voting package for the applicable school board trustee.

The Township of Zorra has transitioned to electronic voting for the 2022 municipal election! Eligible voters will be able to cast their vote by internet and telephone. A Voting PIN Letter will be mailed to those that are on the Voters' List in the end of September. The Voting PIN Letter will contain an individualized PIN for the voter to use to cast their vote. The voter simply follows the instructions in their kit and chooses between telephone voting or internet voting.

To vote by telephone, the voter will call the number provided in the voting kit, enter the individualized PIN number and the voter's birth date, and then the voter will cast their vote (and use the '#' button to confirm the selections).

To vote by internet, the voter will visit the voting website provided in the voting PIN letter. The voter will enter the last 8 digits of their Voter ID number, their PIN, and the voters' year of birth. The voter will follow the prompts through all contests, and complete their ballot by pressing 'Cast Ballot'.

Voting will be open from October 13, 2022 to October 24, 2022.

Beginning on October 13, 2022 until the end of Voting Day on October 24, Eligible Voters may attend the Township Municipal Office during office hours to use the Computer, Internet access or touch-tone telephone provided, for voting purposes.

Township staff will be available for support and for residents to use computers, access the internet or utilize a touch-tone telephone as follows:



As a result of that delegation, the Zorra Splash Committee (ZSC) was formed. Six Embro residents were appointed to the committee – Crystal Finch, Emily Moitoso, Danika Lyons, Alicia McCall-VanGinkel, Victoria Cybulski, and Debbie Baker – as well as Councillor Steve MacDonald.

The ZSC has worked tirelessly over the past few years to bring a splash pad to Embro. The committee has encouraged community support for the project, worked alongside the Township staff to provide advice to Council on the design and construction of the project, and led community fundraising efforts.

Construction for the Embro splash began in July this year, and the grand opening party for the splash pad took place on August 24th.

It is no secret that a community is enriched by the contributions of those who live and work there. Significant improvements, like splash pads, don't happen by accident. They happen because enough people step up with their shared vision for exciting new things that simply make a place better than before. This is exactly what happened in Embro, with the shared dream for a place to play, cool off, and gather. The Zorra Splash Committee has completed the task of shaping the project, promoting it, and undertaking significant fundraising. This was done mostly during a pandemic when it seemed impossible to do anything, but they knocked it out of the park. This is the drive that our community volunteers have. Incredible!






